was supposed to be the end of the Special Session. They were unable to adjorn by Midnight so a Second Special Session started and extended through the early morning hours of April 11th. Finally an agreement was reached! The Governor has until May 5, 2012, to sign the final budget. Thank you for all of your advocacy efforts!!
