First Respectful
Language Bill



Focused on using people first language on new and revisited laws

HB 1694**
Reauthorization
and Strengthening
of ACCT
(Agency Council

Transportation)



ACCT was reauthorized as well as including a complaint process that all of the transit providers had to put into place

**2005
SHB 1711**
Accessible
Parking




Removed "disabled" from accessible parking signs

**2008
SB 6313**
Disability History
Month




Designates October as Disability History Month and schools must promote disability history in some way

**2006
ESHB 2479**
Disability Access
Voting



Adds 20 days to the time that accessible voting machines are available for use

**2009
HB 1835**
Second Respectful
Language Bill



Directs the code reviser to come up with a bill to take out the word "mental retardation" and replace it with "intellectual disability" where appropriate

**2007
ESHB 1050**
Kevin's Law



Transition age students can graduate with their class and then continue with transition services

**2010
HB 2490**
Third Respectful
Language Bill



The code reviser put together this bill that listed over 30 instances in the law where "mental retardation" could be replaced with "intellectual disability"
